DRUG TAKE BACK DAY

National Drug take-back day encourages the public to return unwanted or expired prescription drugs to be disposed of safely. Drug take back day occurs twice annualy, in April and October. In April of 2022, 5,144 collection sites took back over 7,900 tons of unwanted medications. Proper drug disposal not only eliminates the risk of medictions contaminating our natural resources, but prevent medications from being used by other individuals in the home, such as children, other family members, or visitors.

On Saturday, October 29th, Plymouth County Outreach will be participating in several drug take back day events. We encourage you to clean out your medicine cabinets and visit one of our drug take back locations from 10:00am - 2:00pm to safely dispose of your unwated or expired prescription medications! Both locations in Plymouth and the Center at Sachem Rock will be accepting sharps. Please bring your sharps in an enclosed, hard plastic container, such as a tide laundry detergent container.
