## **OVERDOSE STATISTICS 2/1/19 - 2/28/19:**



118 incidents



36 successful home visits\*
The outreach team made contact with a SUD, family/friend or both.



81% non-fatal

9% fatal

10% at-risk\*

\*A loved one reported this individual due to concern of potential overdose.

59% of the individuals PCO followed up with accepted some form of treatment

A recently filed bill in the state Legislature would allow law enforcement officers- in addition to medically trained personal- to provide civilians with the overdose-reversing drug Narcan and train them in how to administer it. The bills sponsors represent communities in Plymouth County. All of the PCO Police Departments are in support of this bill
