PUBLIC HEALTH UPDATE:



The Massachusetts Department of Public Health has issued a public alert about a Hepatitis A outbreak. The state said most of the cases are in people experiencing homelessness and/or substance use disorders. It is important to raise awareness of the outbreak and encourage individuals to get vaccinated in order to help prevent the spread of Hepatitis A.
