National Drug Take Back Day



The next National Prescription Drug Take-back Day will be held on Saturday, October 26th, 2019. National Drug Take-back days allow individuals to dispose of unused or expired prescription drugs in a safe and responsible way. On the most recent National Take-back Day in April of 2019, the DEA collected 937,443 pounds (468.72 tons) of prescription medications (getsmartaboutdrugs.gov, 2019).
