PCO UPDATE



On October 24th , PCO in collaboration with the Plymouth Youth Development Collaborative and the Plymouth Area Prevention Collaborative, successfully hosted drug take back day! Approximately 115 pounds of medication was turned in at the event, as well as two large containers of sharps. The team was also able to distribute 75 Deterra pouches for community members and had narcan available for those interested.
