PUBLIC HEALTH ALERT



A growing number of individuals have experienced serious reactions after taking Phenibut, an unapproved anxiety drug sold in some dietary supplements. Reports have shown individuals utilizing it for its euphoric effects alongside other substances. Taking Phenibut alongside other substances that depress the central nervous system- including alcohol, benzodiazepines, or opioids, is incredibly dangerous.
