### **SPIKE ALERT**



Between Friday, April 16, 2021 and Monday, May 10, 2021, Plymouth County Outreach has documented three (3) double overdose fatality incidents; three separate incidents where two individuals had used substances together and fatally overdosed, resulting in six deaths. PCO and its partners want the public, especially individuals at risk for overdose and their families and friends, to be aware of the increased risk of an overdose and what action you can take. Please be aware that anyone using any substance purchased off the street is at risk of an overdose. It is suspected that Fentanyl is being mixed with other non-opioid substances such as cocaine and street pills marked as Xanax. To read the full press release, visit our website here:
